Dear Friends and music lovers,

Port Fairy has been an important part of my life and for decades I have called Port Fairy home over summer and other holiday periods. The Port Fairy Spring Music Festival has similarly been a great way to enjoy music in a beautiful setting. I know many of our Friends share my passion and have enjoyed these experiences over many years.

I have had the honour to Chair the Festival over the last decade as we evolved and navigated the challenges of a global pandemic. We are pleased that our Festival has emerged from this challenging period, stronger than ever.

In our first newsletter – our March edition – we included a series of images of our 2022 Festival. This edition also includes photos of the extraordinary musical journey we all took last October.

Our Artistic Directors' message also includes an insight into the gems that we are planning for the October Festival this year.

Over three decades, the Festival has been the home of many new commissions and world premiere performances. We have more than a decade of engagement with the local Indigenous community. The Festival has also provided opportunities for emerging and leading musicians to perform to such engaged audiences. Stefan Cassomenos, for example, made a solo Festival debut in 2004. The Festival is however only possible with the financial and volunteer support from many others in the community. Our Festival volunteers play a critical role in delivering the annual Festival.

We are also incredibly appreciative of our loyal donors and philanthropists, who we pay tribute to in this newsletter.

All donations help support our work in the community, the quality of the program and also allows us to maintain an accessible ticket price.
